Recognize trauma reactions, substance-induced psychosis, and other co-occurring conditions. Use FAST awareness and CARE positioning tactics to reduce escalation and gain compliance.

Explore diversion pathways and coordinated responses with EMS and peer navigators. Build personal resilience through practical wellness strategies for sustained performance in high-stress environments.
